

West Park is named after John M. West, an early settler who owned a farm house and 90 acres of land near what is now W 137 and Lorain Avenue. Over a century ago our neighborhood was named “West’s Park” after his generosity and welcoming nature as he allowed neighbors to enjoy their leisure time on his land at a picnic area that included his pond and row boats. It later became a township and today West Park is a vibrant neighborhood of engaged residents.

Information Station 16610 Chatfield Ave

A garden of outdoor 'rooms', to wander through and relax in their spaces. With perennial, tropical and native plants, art, upcycled water feature, the shed/60s bar, fire pit and more.

Daylily Garden – 16820 Chatfield Ave
We are an organic garden. We grow and hybridize daylilies.

16609 Chatfield Ave
A beautiful blend of perennial favorites like daisies, lilies, snow on the mountain, black-eyed susans, zinnias and other summer must-haves.

Urban Farm – 16510 Chatfield Ave
This small garden features several varieties of tomatoes, green and yellow bell peppers, standard and round zucchini, white and purple German Eggplant, spaghetti and butternut squash, and basil. An impressive quantity in a limited space.

The Secret Garden! – 3974 W 162 St
The front yard reels you in with beautiful plants. But make your way to the back yard and through the gate and find yourself in a wonderful secret garden. Tropical plants, wildflowers, bogs with carnivorous plants, fruit trees and so much more. We have bee hives, chickens, frogs and fish. A truly magical and special place.

3933 W 160 St
This garden was built by Wenzel Spicka and John Ferenschitz ca 1928. It was entered in a garden contest sponsored by the *Plain Dealer* in 1930 and won second place. The garden features a fountain, small castle, arbors, flower pots and plant stands all constructed from cement. Recent metal sculptures makes it a must see! (Research by West Park Historian Gary Swilik)

Seaside Escape – 4064 W 160 St
Gardens all along the back yard. Many varieties of flowers to enjoy. Along with an ocean-themed back fence.

4128 W 161 St
Extensive front and back yard landscape beds. Side of house has raised kitchen garden beds.

16902 Woodbury Ave
A garden that continues to grow and change with each year, overflowing front to back with color and texture. No chemicals are used, only hard work and love.

16903 Woodbury Ave
When dogs and kids run your garden, you turn to planters, pots and hanging baskets. Please enjoy our Woodbury little library on your way.

16508 Elsienna Ave
Three separate gardens: A formal front yard with planters on the porch. A large open area perfect for outdoor games. A pleasant shaded hideaway from the world with garden art, perennials and a multitude of pots with annuals.

17212 Elsienna Ave

Many perennials surround yard with water garden feature and certified wild life habitat. Assorted annuals and vegetable garden.

17113 Laverne Ave

Flower beds with some emphasis on native species; a pergola with clematis and wisteria; a square-foot vegetable garden; blueberries, raspberries and strawberries. We draw in butterflies, bees and birds by creating habitat and offering bird food while keeping away groundhogs and skunks. Debra has lots of herbs which she dries for use in cooking, medicinal purposes and herbal teas.

16716 Laverne Ave

Patio with benches, screened porch, park bench and fire pit. Perennial and annual flowers. Garden started 50 years ago by my wife, Lois Anne.

16705 Laverne Ave

Our informal cottage garden beds are dense with hosta, hydrangea, lamb's ears, clematis, herbs and more. Vines clamber up fence posts, structures and pergola. Filled with vintage decor, romance and sweetness, It's friendly and comforting. Two patios offer plenty of seating options. Catch a glimpse of our fat cat enjoying the shade.

16612 Laverne Ave

Perennial border garden designed to make the most of a small irregularly shaped yard. With lots of native and naturalizing plants, this peaceful garden offers shelter and enticing food sources to birds, butterflies, and bees.

16815 Woodbury Ave

Large yard with quaint front and back porches, lovely border gardens filled with perennial flowers, herbs and vegetables and accents of potted flowers.

16901 Milburn Ave

Always a work in progress; a small vegetable garden, pond, partial edible landscaping, rabbit hutch and topiary are a some of the features.

4139 Rustic Rd

Many perennials surround the backyard, while annuals are added for additional color. A large raised bed is flourishing with many different types of vegetables.

17139 Fernshaw Ave

Ornamental trees, plants, hanging plants, potted flowers, statuary, "stained glass" window, "log waterfall," stone bench, stone patio, stone walls, deck with pergola.

3752 W 176 St

Our 50+ years old Dawn Redwood tree is center stage, tucked behind garage with water fountain and sitting area. The front has a shaded small sitting porch with nice curb appeal.

15800 Norway Ave

Business in the front, party in the back! Northern Cal vibe in the front, and backyard a secret oasis with dappled shade, a variety of perennials, annuals, evergreens and garden art sprinkled throughout. Individual garden "rooms" invite you to sit and perhaps take in details you might miss upon first look.

16700 Ernadale Ave

My garden has low and high blueberry bushes, raised beds, hostas, daylilies, black-eyed susans, purple cone flowers and ground covers.

3581 W 155 St

Our garden and deck are the center of entertainment and dining from spring through fall. From our table we can view the display change from daffodils and tulips to a variety of perennials including roses, daisies, coneflowers, clematis, trumpet vine and hydrangeas. Hostas are the anchor of our landscape.

3638 Rockport Ave

Many perennials in both front and back, along with chickens, beehives and garden art.

**English Cottage Garden –
3675 W 148 St**

This garden has evolved over 20 years and includes roses, perennials and

vegetables. It is a respite from busy daily life with a water feature, shade garden and pleasant patio. The garden also hosts chickens and bees.

14610 Bartter Ave

We have an ornamental garden: color, design, water movement, and texture with winding paths, trees, bushes, perennials, annuals, statuary, trolls, gnomes, and fairies. (We have redeveloped the front yard garden).

13519 Fairwood Rd

The backyard is planted in shades of pink and has a quirky up-cycled water feature. Front and side yards have pops of jewel-toned color. Most plants were started from seed in a greenhouse in early spring, with a focus on perennials and biennials. The garden beds were created within the last four years, and are always expanding and evolving!

Community Garden**3711 W 138th St**

A Community Garden less than 10 years old with 39 individually rented raised beds, peach and apple trees, strawberry bed, blackberry brambles, and picnic area. Tucked away in the Jefferson neighborhood of West Park, SDCG has competed in the Cuyahoga County Fair Community Garden Displays in 2018 and 2019, taking 3rd and 2nd place respectively.
