An historic neighborhood, Glenville offers stunning historic homes, buildings, and churches. Beautiful century homes line Rockefeller Park, home of the famed Cleveland Cultural Gardens, a unique collection of different gardens representing different countries and cultures. Glenville is the birthplace of Superman, an important stop on the Civil Rights Trail, home to a large selection of street art and green spaces, a harbor of great Cajun-comfort-food restaurants, and is a neighborhood in a season of revival.

★ **Information Station — Italian Cultural Garden, Upper Level, 990 East Blvd**
Including a lower level on Martin Luther King Blvd in addition to the East Blvd upper level, the Italian Cultural Garden was conceived and designed in the spirit of the Italian Renaissance with large walkways, balustrades, benches and two large winding staircases leading down to lower level amphitheater. A large Renaissance fountain modeled after the fountain in the Villa Medici in Rome, Italy sits in the center piazza. Dedicated October, 1930 as “a symbol of the contribution of Italian culture to American democracy.”

1 **Community Garden — MyGrowConnects Nursery, 793 East Blvd**
All natural grower and farmers market resource provider.

2 **Rockefeller Park & Greenhouse 750 E 88 St**
First constructed at turn of the last century as part of 200-acre park donated by J. D. Rockefeller. Initially used to grow plants for landscaping City Parks and Gardens, has evolved include a botanical garden with specialty plant collections, seasonal floral displays, outdoor classrooms, and theme gardens. Open 10:00-4:00.

3 **9629 Thorn Ave**
Beautiful flowers are an addition to any home and neighborhood. They help to beautify the space of a yard.

4 **1081 E 99 St**
I do my gardening to teach and educate the neighbors that their yards can be beautiful.

5 **9909 Ostend Ave**
Flowers, white flower pots in the yard. My pride and joy goes in the yard.

6 **9915 Ostend Ave**
Various beds of perennials, flowering from spring through fall with a variety of added colorful annuals.

7 **9919 Ostend Ave**
Work in progress of red roses, yellow roses and variety of plants.

8 **10015 Ostend Ave**
Because I love to make my neighborhood look nice. I have gardened for 15 years.

9 **10017 Ostend Ave**
To encourage the neighborhood that it can be nice and clean and with flowers.

10 **9922 Ostend Ave**
Rookie gardener — it’s the beginning of something new for our home.

11 **1167 East 99 St**
Flower beds front and side of home with a burst of colorful plants.

12 **9816 Westchester Ave**
Front yard flower bed full of seasonal plants.

13 **9811 Westchester Ave**
Flower bed in front of house with a spice of color.

14 **1136 E 98 St**
Flower beds that bring the beautiful smell of mother nature.

15 **1483 E 105 S**
Front and backyards with a vast assortment of annuals and perennials, plus a fountain surrounded by a rose arbor.

16 **10709 Ashbury**
Adding a touch of color to the neighborhood with a variety of flowers

17 **Community Garden — Cleveland Cultural Gardens, Martin Luther King Blvd and East Blvd**
Started in 1916, stretches 3 miles along Martin Luther King Jr. Drive and East Boulevard near University Circle. There more than 30 established gardens.
