

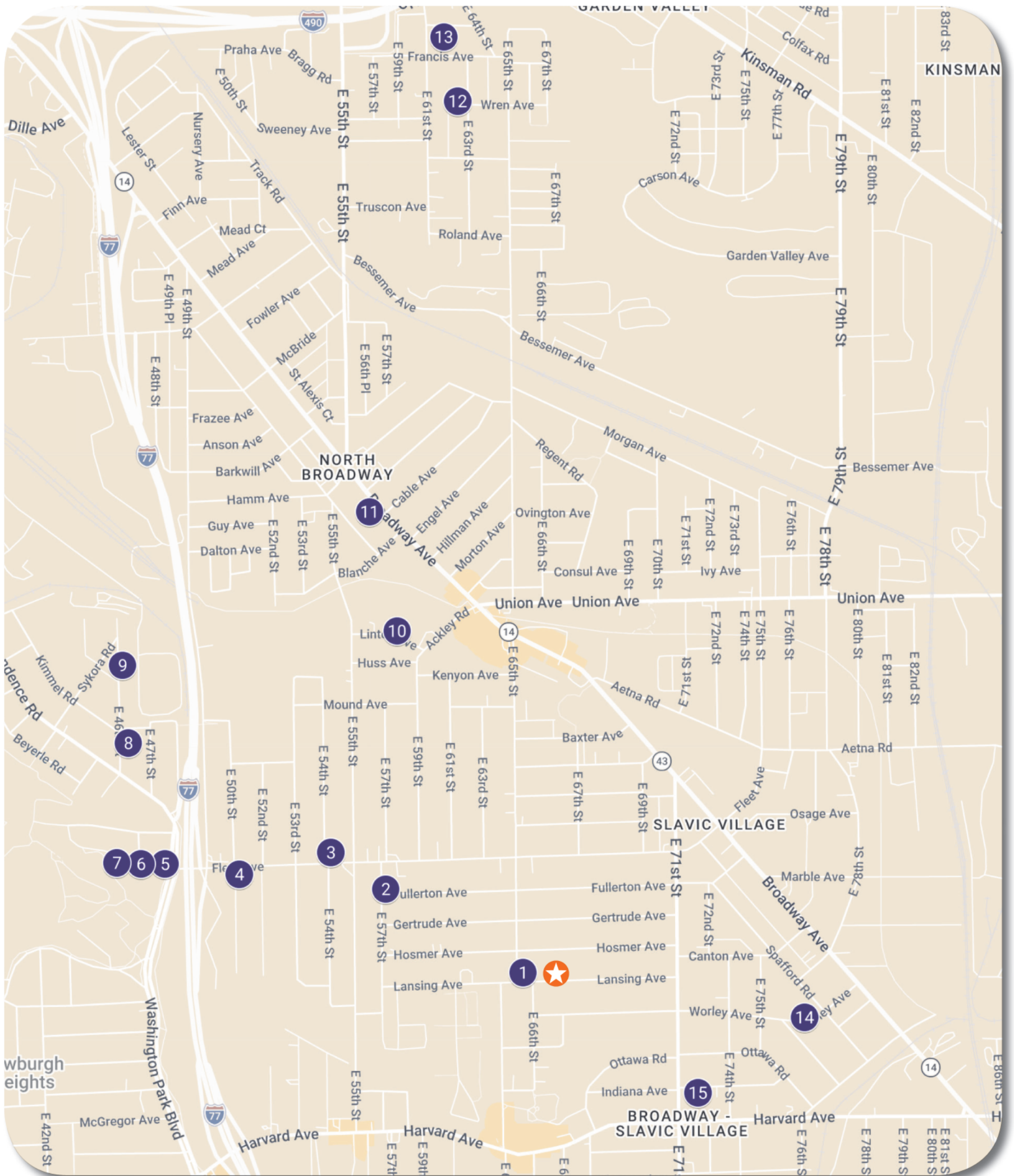

1. 6501 Lansing Ave

Polish American Cultural Center, JPPII "Heritage Garden"

The PACCJPPII "Heritage Garden" consists of a circular walking path, various trees, plants, and shrubs highlighted by 27 educational placards. The placards share a unique story of the struggle of life for the country of Poland, along with Polish American history. There is a central monument of two eagles. An American Eagle and a Polish Eagle. Intertwined in flight: the brotherhood of two nations.

2. 5701 Fullerton Ave

Walter Hyde Garden of Life

It is a memorial garden featuring a wind phone. It also has a fence for people to write the name of loved ones they have lost.

3. 5401 Fleet Ave

Andreoli Restoration Fabrication shop garden

The front section is a public sculpture garden. The rear inside of the fence off of E 54th is our floral, fruit and veggie garden.

4. 5002 Fleet Ave

Fleet Bike

Beautiful rose garden with giant cactus bird houses and wind chimes.

5. 3754 Crete Rd

An ever-evolving 1/3-acre garden butted up against Washington Park. New features this year include woodland border walk, Zen garden, and mini meadow. **|N|**

6. 4700 Pallister Dr

I have been tending my backyard for 5 years working to foster pollinators, plants and whatever critters make the world work.

7. 4500 Pallister Dr

Come and enjoy our beautiful outdoor touch of the rainbow. A variety of annuals and perennials permeate throughout the 7 lovely garden beds that adorn the century home property. Flowers beds range from partial sun to full shade. **|W|**

8. 3609 E 46th St

Central garden with patio space.

9. 3529 E 46th St

Little bit of everything—wildflowers, pets, perennials, annuals—garden. **|N|**

10. 5705 Linton Ave

Lemonade Stand. This garden was originally my neighbor's driveway- then the school bought the property and put in a fence. This makes lemonade out of lemons. **|N|**

11. 5742 Broadway Ave

Mural Park

Located in the heart of Broadway commercial corridor, this public greenspace features natural quarry rock seating, garden perennials, plenty of shade thanks to healthy tree canopy, and the "It Takes a Village" public art mural. Mural was painted in 2005 with over 100 community members. **|N|**

12. 2994 E 63rd St

The Urban Queen Bee Farms

Unique features include a 72x30 greenhouse, youth-led growing spaces, and art-infused garden designs that promote healing, education, and intergenerational connection.

13. 6113 Francis Ave

The Urban Queen Bee Farms

Urban Queen Bee Garden is a vibrant urban farm rooted in wellness, sustainability, and community. We cultivate fresh produce, pollinator plants, and honey through our active beehives. **|H|**

14. 7617 Worley Ave

Worley Park

Collaborating with residents over several years, SVD worked to transform a once-blighted property into a flourishing pollinator garden. Worley Park is featured on the Wild Ones NEO Native Habitat Corridor & includes native trees, flowering pollinators, reclaimed stone and wood, and public art. **|N|**

15. 7116 Indiana Ave

Iron Ward Oasis: Nicknamed the Iron Ward 150 years ago from all the steel making, Slavic Village was once full of home farms on small city plots. That soil-loving tradition continues at this 130-year-old, double-lot homestead just outside the Goosetown district. Part vegetable garden, part perennial bed, part forest-in-the-making, the property proves that nature still rules in the heart of the city.
