

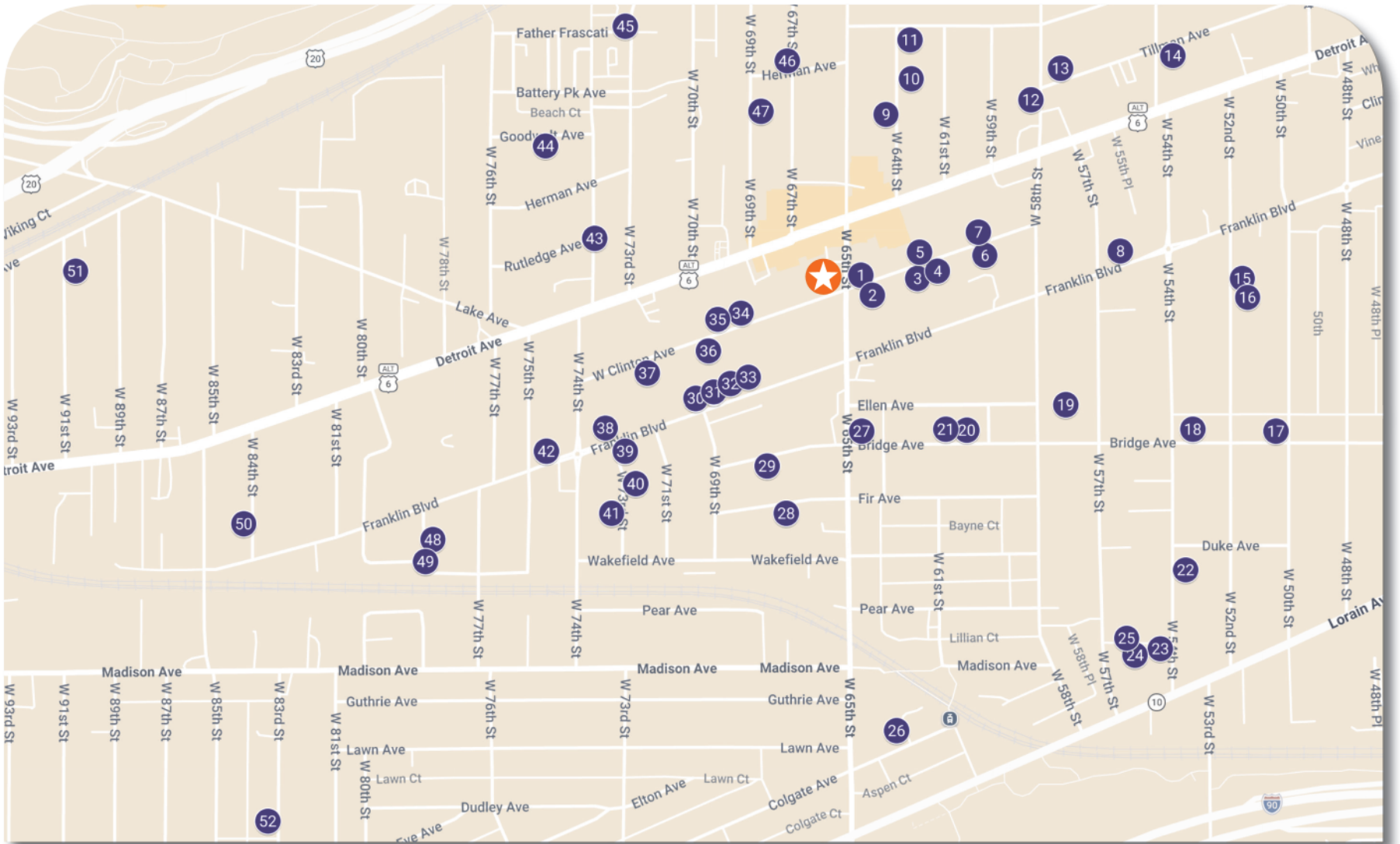
DETROIT SHOREWAY

Detroit Shoreway is located two miles west of downtown Cleveland on a bluff overlooking Lake Erie. Detroit Shoreway is one of Cleveland's most diverse neighborhoods and is home to the Gordon Square Arts District, Cleveland EcoVillage, Lorain Ave Antiques District and more. It is a thriving, vibrant and walkable neighborhood known for beloved small businesses and tight-knit groups of residents.

1. Labyrinth Park

(W 65th St & W Clinton Ave)

Created and maintained by the W Clinton Block Club, featuring a meditation walk by local artist Melissa Daubert and a sculpture by the late John Jackson.

2. 6415 W Clinton Ave

Plot Against Hunger

Plot Against Hunger: garden provided by church members to provide fresh produce to Community Meal attendees. The church will be open for restrooms.

3. 6305 W Clinton Ave

A densely-planted semi-wild flower and plant garden including oxeye sunflower, purple coneflower, Ohio spiderwort, roses, large lilies, and a vegetable garden. [|N|](#)

4. 6209 W Clinton Ave

A colorful mix of annuals, perennials, and backyard vegetables surrounds the home. A side path leads to a quiet backyard oasis, while porch flower boxes and a whimsical shopping cart planter add charm and personality to the garden.

5. 6212 W Clinton Ave

The gardens consist of a front yard foundation planting using ornamental trees, shrubs & perennials. The back yard is a series of interconnected patio "Garden Rooms" surrounded by beds featuring flowering trees, shrubs, perennials & annual flowers with environments ranging from full sun to shade.

6. 6003 W Clinton Ave

My front garden has more of a cottage garden feel. The treelawn is planted with herbs. The back garden is a shady retreat with a pond and waterfall. It's always ten degrees cooler! Come visit my two huge 18 year old koi Moby and Mabel. [|W|](#)

7. 6002 W Clinton Ave

Once part of the "Needham Castle" property. Many perennials and fruit trees as well as artwork by the homeowners.

8. 5510 Franklin Blvd

We have a native garden that was landscaped in 2025 by Antonio Zodda from Paradise Natives, with some additional annuals planted for the season. The garden features a small brick walking path built with bricks found on the property, and labeled plants. [|N|](#)

9. 1348 W 64th St, Apt Up

Balcony Bucket Bloomers: Balcony container food forest and native oasis. This upcycled, organic garden of native plants and edible plants is a popular hangout for birds and other native pollinators. Grown using companion planting and traditional methods sustainably. [|N|](#)

Welcome! We built our garden for year-round interest. Blooming early March to November, it provides architectural interest through the winter & an exciting variety of color, species & texture through spring, summer & fall. We continue to explore what does well in our west side climate. From annuals to perennials, flowers, shrubs, and trees, we hope you'll take time to enjoy this year's bloom!

14. 5309 Tillman Ave

Welcome to our humble but colorful urban garden! Our toddler picks the flowers and we do the hard work.

15. 1781 W 52nd St

Side and back yard garden; just a nice place for us to relax.

16. 1785 W 52nd St

The front yard features various perennials, including roses, ferns, and black-eyed Susan. The backyard has raised beds for flowers and vegetables.

17. 5004 Bridge Ave

An ever evolving urban homestead that includes a vegetable garden, fruit trees, chickens and countless native pollinators. [|N|](#) [|C|](#)

18. 5302 Bridge Ave

20. 5910 Bridge Ave

A garden filled with accessories, daisies, sunflowers, other pollinator friendly flowers and fairy houses.

21. 6006 Bridge Ave

Tree lawn, front yard, back yard.

22. 1933 W 54th St

This double lot home has an English cottage style garden throughout the property, a product of the prior owners who designed the landscaping. Current owners of five years have made minimal changes to maintain the aesthetic, a significant amount of upkeep! We are proud of our and garden and happy to be a part of this years walk.

23. 1974 W 54th St

We hand weed our no mow lawn which features tall floppy grasses and yarrow. The porch is secluded by several oak leaf hydrangeas. We plant a cherry tomato in front of the porch for neighborhood kids to sit in the grass and enjoy or eat under the branches of our weeping redbud. Our tree lawn features a carpet of lemon thyme, herbs, echinacea, flowering kale and a rose growing up the lamp post. [|N|](#)

24. 5505 Ithaca Ct

Ithaca Court Community Gardens

Sizeable community garden with 40 plots maintained by local gardeners. Includes a straw bale shed, large compost pile and lots of veggie growing of different types. Gardens are on both sides of the road.

25. 5500 Ithaca Court between W 54th and W 57th

Ithaca Court Occasional House

The Occasional House is an Airbnb whose profits go towards maintaining the community gardens surrounding it. We work with local kids, teaching gardening and other skills. We are a 'Guest Favorite' considered in the top 5% of all Airbnbs. [|W|](#)

26. 2027 W 65th St

St. Colman Courtyard and Community Garden

The Fr. Bob Begin Courtyard is an oasis of peace and beauty. The new St. Colman Community Garden is a volunteer led effort to grow vegetables, herbs, flowers, etc. to benefit the community.

27. 1863 W 65th St

A small, sidewalk-adjacent garden for the enjoyment of bugs and other creatures as well as folks walking past. Mostly native plants, including golden Alexander, echinacea, milkweed, and more. Also features exotics like hostas and a weeping cherry tree. [|N|](#)

28. 6615 Fir Ave

Back yard and large side lot with flower beds, raised garden beds, and trees.

29. 6707 Bridge Ave

Betty's Memorial Garden

Raised beds, fruit trees, native perennials, and a trellis. [|N|](#) [|W|](#)

30. 6818 Franklin Blvd

The front yard is a rain garden and flower garden. The back yard is a permaculture garden with fruit trees and bushes.

31. 6814-6816 Franklin Blvd

We grow Native and Medicinal plants to promote biodiversity. [|N|](#)

35. 6902 W Clinton Ave

Lawn was replaced with native (mostly) or edible plants three years ago. Come early if you would like some purple coneflowers, scullcap and/or mountain mint for your garden. |N|

36. 7001 W Clinton Ave

Tomatoes, peppers, and cucumbers are featured in the vegetable garden. Hostas and cut flowers decorate the backyard beds.

37. 7205 W Clinton Ave

Sun, shade, and lots of flowers in ever-expanding beds in both the front and back yards. Front porch is a lush oasis of potted plants. Small pond with goldfish in the back and a 100 year old oak planted by the home's original owner. |N| |W|

38. 7300 Franklin Blvd

Tucked behind the tall pine trees, this garden offers a nice getaway. take time to sit inside the pergola and enjoy the sounds of the birds and the tranquility of the backyard atmosphere.

39. 7209 Franklin Blvd

Our backyard has all kinds of tucked away spaces for our toddler and our pups to play! Come check out our curly willow, fruit trees, and natives scattered about our front and back yards. |N|

40. 1903 W 73rd St

(Front Yard Only) Native plant pollinator garden & vegetable garden. |N|

41. 1918 W 73rd St

A bright, colorful house surrounded by an eclectic mix of annuals, perennials, herbs & vegetables. Come walk through the garden and feel the love!

42. 7414 Franklin Blvd

Eclectic front garden comprised primarily of inherited plants from three generations of gardeners slowly taking over lawn. Looking for ideas to expand further with more natives.

43. Corner of W 74th St and Rutledge Ave

Legacy Garden

Thriving for 14 years in the historic Edgewater Hill neighborhood, Legacy Garden is now home to 40+ garden beds. Lush raspberry and blackberry brambles grow alongside a mature hydrangea hedge. A fire pit, gathering area, and picnic bench highlight our community space while a handcrafted stand on the north of the property invites neighbors to enjoy donated produce each week during season.

44. 7427 Goodwalt Ave

Attempting flowers and vegetables - doing what we can with 2 toddler boys :)

45. 1236 W 73rd St

Flower garden with multiple dahlia specimens and unusual perennials.

46. 6702 Herman Ave

Small but mighty garden is around back of house: vegetables, herbs, flowers, natives, legacy plants from my grandparents and great-grandparents' gardens. Used my old foundation stones to build some beds, as well as Akron street bricks for the patio. |N|

47. 1321 W 69th St

The highlights of this West Side Little Italy double-lot cottage garden include raised potager style beds, an expansive rose collection, and an extensive collection of fruit trees & bushes. Designed with a penchant for traditional garden design with a goal of maximum edibles! The 100th anniversary Our Lady Mt Carmel Church procession walks right past our house in the early afternoon - join us!

48. 1925 W 79th St

Artist studio with monochrome color palette of the darkest plants to match the black color of the house. Plantings include purple smoke tree, purple elderberry, black mondo grass, Japanese painted ferns, and bronze fennel.

49. Wakefield Ave between W 79th and W 80th

Albert Hart Orchard and Garden

Community orchard and gardens began as a dumping ground that was transformed with a grant and volunteer work. Now a space with 30 different species of fruit and nut trees along with brambles, grapes, and rentable garden plots.

50. 1450 W 84th St

Front yard featuring native plants including coneflowers and rudbeckia, young Pawpaw (*Asimina triloba*) trees, and edible plants. |N|

51. 1289 W 91st St

Flower garden with vegetable garden mixed in; many bird features surrounding a brick patio with repurposed bricks. |N|

52. 2082 W 83rd St

Large pond with two waterfalls. Stone patio and walkway, native plants. |N| |W|
