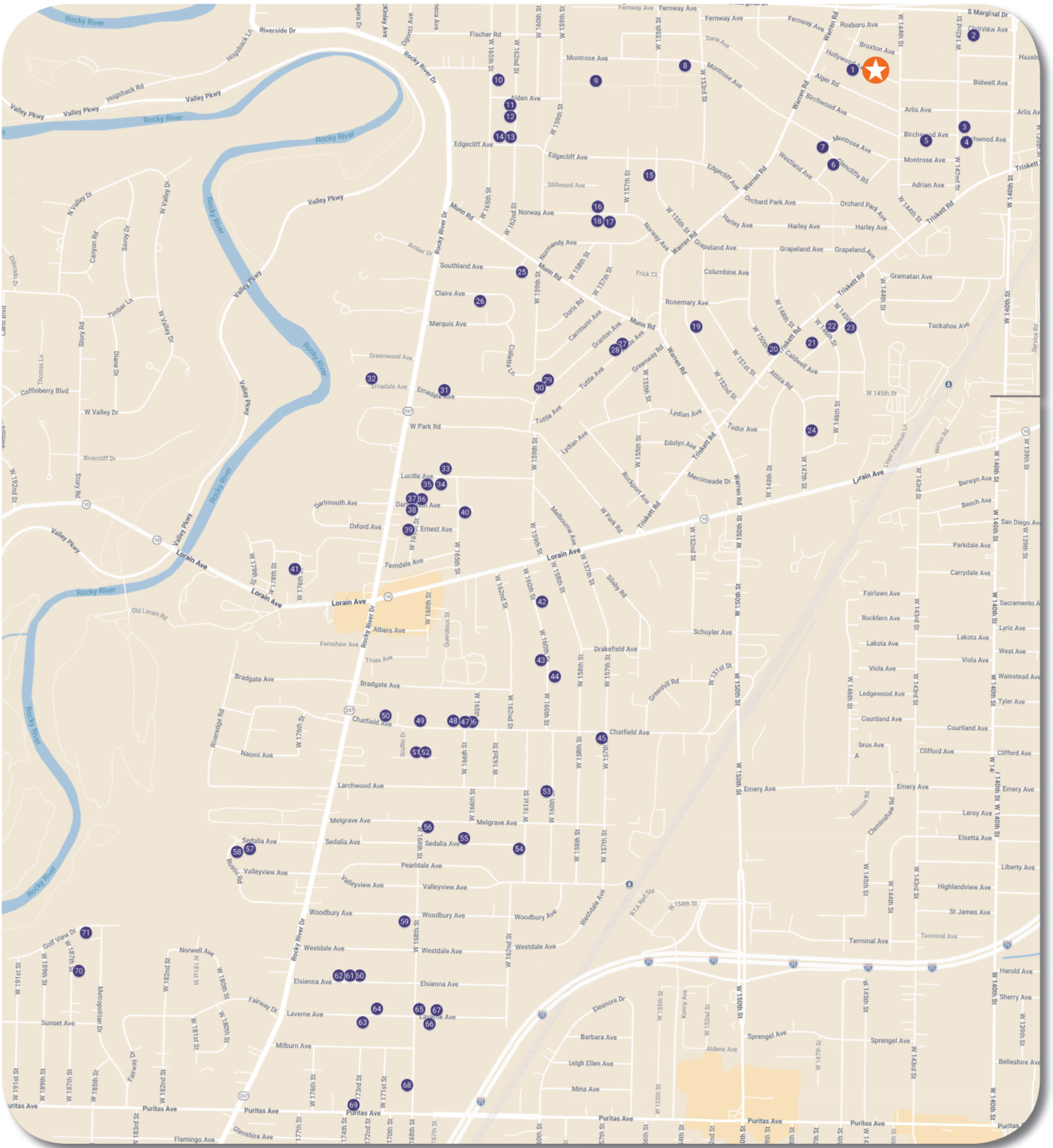

1. 14521 Hollywood Ave

Backyard refuge, a beautiful mess. Native perennial flowers and grasses, herbs, tomatoes, and veggies in double raised beds bask in the sun. Heuchera and hosta fill out the shade. A stately pair of mature hydrangeas bloom if they feel like it. New this year is a growing collection of thrifted garden art, and of course, more plants. [|N|](#)

2. 14113 Clairview Ave

A vibrant garden with raised vegetable and flower beds, surrounded by a variety of herbs. A rustic greenhouse made from old windows was built last year, adding unique character to the space.

3. 3239 W 142nd St

I am transitioning from a traditional garden to a more native garden. I am also hoping to one day be a great stop for pollinators. [|N|](#)

4. 3255 W 142nd St

We have a corner lot with flowers in the front yard bright yellow calla lilies. Vegetable in raised beds in the backyard. There's a small greenhouse too. Tomatoes, onions, garlic, eggplant, beans, sweet peppers, cucumbers. We also feature a tumble composter, and solar panels. Take a gander around and enjoy the view!

11. 3202 W 162nd St

The garden can be described as an English garden with the emphasis on attracting bees, birds and butterflies, using native, indigenous plants. It is all organic, including potted vegetables and herbs.

12. 3210 W 162nd St

We add and plant new flowers every year, gradually expanding our garden over time. In addition to the flowers, we also have separate sections for vegetables and herbs. We also plan to set up our "Free Plants Stand" again this year—a feature that was very popular last season.

13. 16202 Edgecliff Ave

Plethora of bright beautiful in ground and hanging baskets.

14. 16206 Edgecliff Ave

In the front yard I have a circular pollinator garden with other pollinators planted along the side of the yard. I have planted many trees and plants around the property on both the front and back of the house. This year I'm adding an Ohio Native Wildflower Garden behind the house. [|N|](#)

21. 14618 Rainbow Ave

This garden has native pollinators, berries, and vegetables grown in a small space using raised beds, trellising, and eliminating traditional grass in favor of flowering plants. [|N|](#)

22. 14518 Rainbow Ave

Welcome to Rainbow Homestead. Offering a variety flowers from across the rainbow. A miniature manmade pond will waterfall, provides fresh water for natures critters. The Outdoor Classroom'. We run a Montessori homeschool pod. In our child-sized garden, kids learn measurement, nomenclature, and observation of nature. We grow natives, ornamentals, herbs, berries & veggies. I like growing plants upwards on trellises. A cozy backyard garden blending raised-bed vegetables, herbs, pollinator flowers, and cottage-style borders. Inspired by relaxed European courtyard gardens, this space is designed for gathering, growing and enjoying the seasons.

Welcome to my new-to-me garden that I inherited from the previous home owner. An array of flowering trees and shrubs, perennials and hostas will delight you. Front and back yards are quaint and charmingly reminiscent of your favorite English garden.

A small-space sparkler, this tiny backyard garden is a pollinator's paradise. Dahlias and zinnias take center stage, each bloom unfolding like a lovely little moment of magic.

31. 16800 Ernadale Ave

Year-round elegance featuring Japanese maples, boxwoods, evergreens, perennials, and seasonal annuals - creating a timeless, refined, and inviting landscape. [|N|](#)

32. 17210 Ernadale Ave

This small perennial garden tucked away on historic Ernadale Ave is an eclectic sanctuary with every vine and flower a reminder of the lost and a celebration of the present; a sacred space filled with the aroma of sweet wisteria, decades old statuary, Irish wishing wells and a tranquility gazebo for meditation. Welcome to Flamingo Acres, where you'll find a myriad of gardens encompassing our home. These gardens feature an array of native and cultivated plants, vegetables, seasonal color, and a rain garden all interspersed with moments of whimsy. Lupine, poppies, fennel and larkspur self seed throughout. Our lawn is a mix of clover, violets, dandelions, and grass. Our yard is bee friendly no pesticides.
